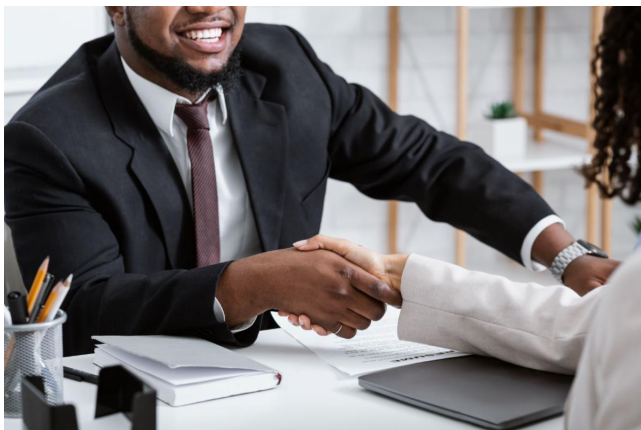
Dec. 6, 2022 - For 24 hours, Colorado comes together to raise fund raise funds for local nonprofits, and we're excited to be part of the day!
